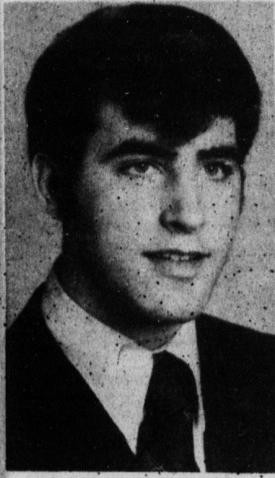


Jimison Is Named To Hospital Post

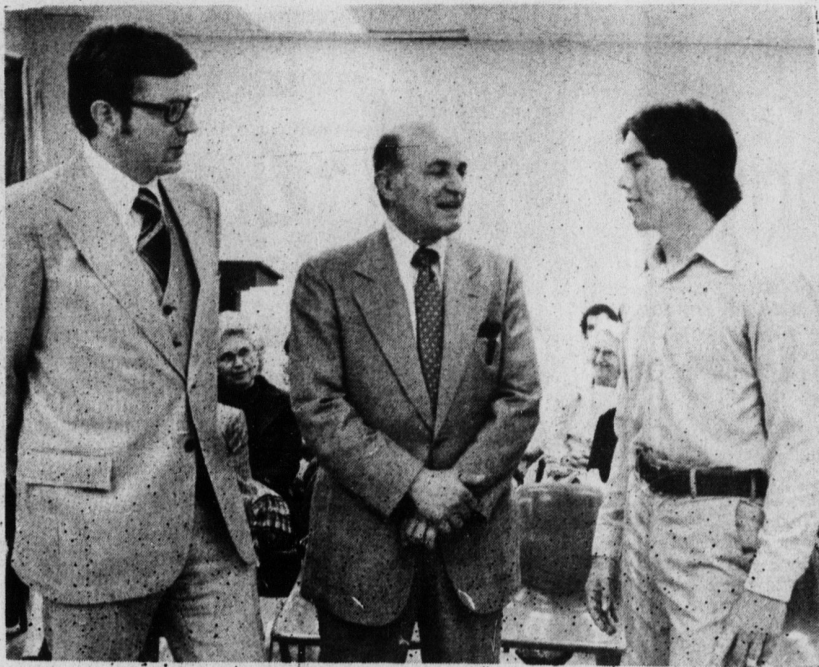

CHARLOTTE — Funeral arrangements are incomplete for James Ernest Smith who died Sunday night.

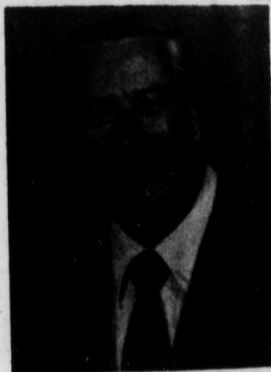

McEwen Funeral Home of Charlotte will handle the arrangements.

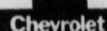

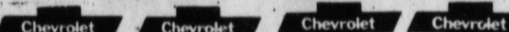
