> PORCH AND PATIO DOORS

Treat the exterior doors on the rear and sides of your home as probable targets for entry. Since they may be less ob-servable from the street and by neighbors than your front entrance, you may need to take extra precau-

YARD LIGHTS

Each exterior entrance about your concern about including the garage door should be well lighted. Post lights in your yard or floodlights mounted under the eaves to prevent blind spots where burglars can hide. Low cost controls for exterior lights will turn them on and off at specified times, or light sensors will illuminate them from dusk to dawn.
