

Lions To Select 'Citizen'

Kings Mountain Lions Club is inviting nominations from the community for a "Citizen of the Year," award honoring either male or female of the community.

Edwin Moore, spokesman for the local club, said nominations should be submitted by May 15 in writing to Lions Clubs Citizen of the Year Award, P.O. Box 1485, Shelby, N. C. 28150.

A banquet will be held in June at which time the Cleveland County Citizen of the Year will be honored with a "traveling trophy" and a special plaque.

Rev. George Sherrill is president of the local club, and said rules for the new award are:

The winner shall be a resident of Cleveland County, North Carolina,

whose contributions or services are to have been performed during the twelve months ending June 30 of the year for which the award is to be made.

The winner may be either male or female.

No person shall be entitled to receive the award more than one time during any ten year period.

The selection shall be made on the following six point basis: Contribution to community welfare during the year (maximum 20 points). Participation in all-around community activities (maximum 20 points). Evidence of lasting contribution to community activities (maximum 20 points). Exhibition of leadership ability (maximum 15 points). Evidence of personal or

business progress (maximum 15 points). Cooperation with individuals and civic organizations (maximum 10 points).

No partiality shall be considered in a determining the winner.

Any club or individual in Cleveland County may nominate a person for the Citizen of the Year Award. When submitting a nomination, as much information as possible, on the above six points should be given. The back of this sheet may be used for nominations, plus additional sheets, as required for the information being submitted.

All nominations should be mailed to the following address, and must be postmarked no later than May 15th: Lions Club's Citizen of the Year Award, P. O. Box 1485, Shelby, N. C. 28150

The winner of the Award will be selected from nominations received, by the Lions Clubs' Citizen of the Year Award Committee, which is composed of one representative from each of the participating Lions Clubs in Cleveland County. The Committee's selection shall be final.

The Award will be presented to the winner at a Citizen of the Year Award Banquet, which will be held during the month of June.
