Most over-the-counter drugs are useful if they are used properly. A cold remedy won't cure a cold, but it can relieve the symptoms. An antacid can ease a stomach ache from too much eating or drinking. But if overdosed, some o-t-c's can become dangerous. Also, some drugs can interact with others in the body to produce undesirable effects. Some can cause unwanted side effects. Some persons are allergic to certain drugs.

The American Pharmaceutical Assoc. recommends: Take medicine only when you need it. Follow the directions on the label; don't overdose. When your physician prescribes a drug, tell him and your pharmacist if you are taking other drugs — even aspirin and antacids — at the time. When you select non-prescription drugs, consult your pharmacist. He's a trained expert in drug use.
