

A Silver Beaver Award For Falls

Otis Cleo Falls Jr. of Kings Mountain will be one of nine adult scout leaders in the Piedmont Council to receive the Silver Beaver Award next month.

The Silver Beaver Award is the highest award granted an adult by the council each year. The award is given for noteworthy service of exceptional character to boyhood.

The awards will be presented at a banquet to be held Fri., Feb. 23, at Gardner-Webb College.

Earning awards, in addition to Falls, are Robert Lacy Dick of

Denver, James Leroy Bollinger of Granite Falls, John H. Stevenson of Statesville, Joe Ed Walker of Lattimore, James Marvin Hipps of Valdese, Larry Allen Hogan of Marion, Margaret Carswell of Morganton and Ned Finley Harbin Jr. of Forest City.

Falls has spent a total of 22 years as an adult Scouter. He has served as a Troop (91) committee member, past committee chairman, scoutmaster, scouting resource chairman and attended Philmont Scoutmaster's Training in Cimarron, New Mexico.

Owner and operator of Falls Exxon in Kings Mountain since 1946, Falls is a lifetime member of St. Matthews Lutheran Church, which sponsors Scout Troop 91. When he became scoutmaster of Troop 91 they had six boys. When he retired as scoutmaster the troop had 137 boys. And at one court of honor 136 of them received awards. Falls has had 10 Eagle Scouts in his troop during his career.

As a Kings Mountain community leader, Falls was voted 1962's Young Man of the Year by the jaycees. He is a member of

the local Masonic Lodge, American Legion and is past chairman of the local Easter Seals campaign. He was president of the Cleveland and Gaston County Service Station Association 1976-1977 and received a Presidential citation of appreciation from the N. C. Council of the International Reading Association. Falls has also served as a director of the Kings Mountain Rescue Squad and was chosen as one of the two top Lutheran scoutmasters in the nation.

Falls is married and has one daughter and one son.

In another matter, the board granted two rights of way to the city of Kings Mountain for extension of streets.

One right of way is included in a sale of 10.8 acres of land to the city. On that piece of property, the city has plans to extend North Sims Street to where it will intersect with

Carpet Lane near Waco Road.

The other right of way will allow the city to extend West Parker Street to where it will intersect with the North Sims Street extension.

In that matter, the right of way was granted with the stipulation that the city maintain the school's property between the West Parker Street extension and the existing creek line.
