

Students Will See Aspects Of Energy

A lively educational program on all aspects of energy will be conducted by North Carolina State University's School of Engineering during a special assembly program at Kings Mountain High School in Kings Mountain on April 26.

The lecture-demonstration program on "Energy Today and Tomorrow" is a dramatic, fast-paced presentation that covers today's energy issues on a level students understand and enjoy

Henry (Hank) Sanders of NCSU's Industrial Extension Service is lecturer of the program and is touring high schools throughout North Carolina.

High school students and their teachers are gaining insight into what energy really is, where it comes from,

how it's used, and why it's getting so expensive. Sponsored by the North Carolina Engineering Foundation, the program is expected to reach more than a half-million North Carolina students within the next three years.

A mechanical engineer, Sanders uses more than \$25,000 worth of electronic teaching devices to demonstrate types of fuels, present and projected methods of power generation, and environmental, social and economic problems. He also offers energy conservation tips.

The program is produced by the Oak Ridge Associated Universities, a non-profit consortium of 43 southern colleges and universities engaged in energy research and education.
