

Little League Fields To Be Fenced

In a special meeting Friday at noon the board of commissioners awarded a contract to American Fence Co. of Charlotte to erect fencing at little league fields at Deal Street Recreation Complex.

The American Fence bid was \$11,875, the lowest of three received last month

by the city. An official of the fence company had requested city to consider releasing the company from the bid, according to Alvin Moretz.

"The reason was a salesman worked up the bid based on the city's specs, but he omitted four gates and 600 feet of fence

from the bid price," Moretz said. "The company spokesman said they would abide by the decision of the city board."

In the special meeting Friday, Commissioner William Grissom said, "A salesman should be able to make a bid based on specifications as well as

the head of his firm. He should, but if not, then that person has no business being a salesman. For this reason I recommend the city accept the bid as submitted."

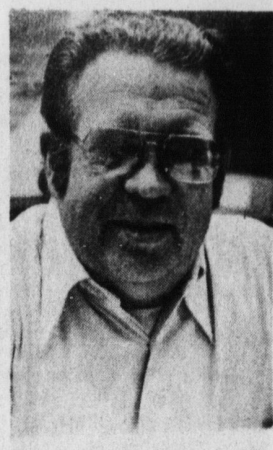
Moretz said the company should begin erecting the fence this week. The contract calls for six-foot high cyclone fence in

the outfields of both new little league fields and the same height fencing at the dugouts. The backstops are to be 15-foot high fencing.

In other action Friday, the board approved the sale of city surplus vehicles and equipment held earlier that day.

The sale, by public

auction, Friday brought in about \$8,000 for dump trucks, automobiles, trucks and mowing machines. The revenue from the sale of scrap aluminum and copper wire, iron and hydrants will be determined after the items are weighed. The sale of these items were by the pound.

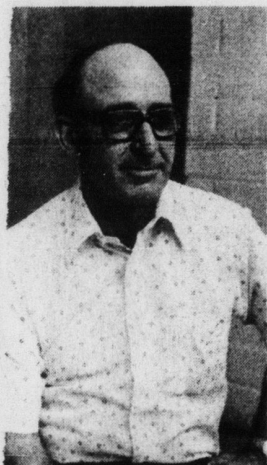
