

Baptist Homes For Aging Dedication Sunday

The Western North Carolina Baptist Homes for the Aging will be dedicated at 3 p.m. on Sun., April 29, with a number of denominational leaders appearing on the program.

Home officials are preparing for as many as 1,000 expected to attend. The event climaxes efforts initiated 3½ years ago when a campaign was launched to raise \$1 million for the Home. Baptists have five similar facilities throughout the state but this is the first one to be built west of Winston-Salem.

The Rev. Ralph L. Cannon of Winston-Salem who directed the campaign will be master of ceremonies.

Others on the program include Executive Director William A. Poole of Winston-Salem; General Secretary-Treasurer Cecil Ray of the Baptist State Convention; Biblical Recorder Editor Marse Grant; Dr. Cecil E. Sherman, pastor of First Baptist Church, Asheville; Dr. W. Perry Crouch of Raleigh, a former pastor at Asheville and retired General Secretary-Treasurer of the Baptist State Convention; Nane

Starnes of Asheville, co-chairman of the fund-raising campaign; Dr. W.R. Wagoner of Thomasville, president of the Baptist Children's Homes and Wade Huey of Marshall. The choir of West Asheville Baptist Church will provide music.

The Home is located in West Asheville at 213 Richmond Hill Dr. The 22-acre site was the former home of Colonelond Pearson. The 51-room facility cost of \$1,650,000 furnished.

Twenty-three residents have already been admitted, some transferred from the other five Baptist Homes at Yanceyville, Hamilton, Albemarle and Winston-Salem.

Features include an arts and crafts center and a chapel. Two wings provide six rooms for couples. Each has a sitting room, bedroom, bath and storage room.

A solarium where residents can bask in the sun is expected to be one of the most popular features, according to Poole.

The medical area has an examination room, medical supply room and a therapy room.

Each room has a smoke detector. There is also an inter-com system which connects each room to the

nursing station and administrative office. There is a call button in each resident's bathroom.

Mrs. Anne Vernon is supervisor, a position she

held at the Baptist Home in Yanceyville since it opened in 1967. She and her husband moved to Asheville in December. Mrs. Ellen Payne is

assistant supervisor and activities coordinator.

Asked what residents want most from a home, Mrs. Vernon replied, "they want to love and be loved.

They want a good place to live and good food, but I think that more than anything else, they want to feel secure. Most of them have been living

alone, dependent on someone else to take them to the doctor and another person to do something else. Families often are far away and can't be on hand

to help. Therefore, they turn to us. They simply need the assurance that there's someone to help them and they're not being left alone."

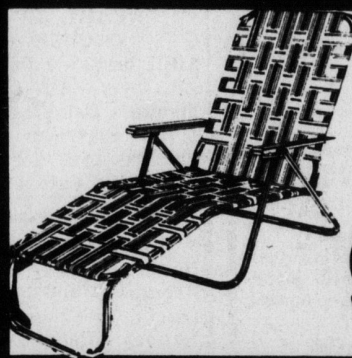

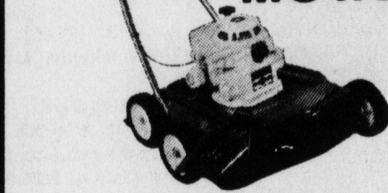

Marine Workshops Set For Summer

Two summer workshops have been scheduled to give teenagers an opportunity to learn about marine resources, ecology of the coastal region and marine-related careers.

The cost for the workshops, including meals, lodging, insurance, equipment fees and field trips, is \$100. Participants must arrange their own transportation.
