another interesting point: Smith apparently has taken dead aim on ending masterful Mike's claim to his 'king of the hill' role at Gaston Speedway, home of the Shrine 100.

The seventh renewal of that spendid event coming up Wednesday night, May 16th in Gastonia with the moustachioed and highlypopular Duval clearly the driver to beat.

Since an inaugural win by Union's Billy Scott in 1973 and a follow-up victory by Stick Elliott, it's been all Mike Duval. The Gaffney speedster has won the last four races at the half-mile track and with room to spare in two of those.

The rivalry between Smith and Duval while friendly, is reaching fever proportions, especially with the way the Kings Mountain man has been pushing his car into victory lane with regularity this season.

Two weeks ago, Smith tore out a transmission and was knocked out of an opportunity to win his fourth at Metrolina and fifth at Cherokee in '79, and it's still early. "But that's all behind

now," said Smith. "We're all cranked up and ready to go again. The May 16th Shrine 100

will draw an entry field of some of the 25 top jocks in the southeast, all with one big objective and that's to do something about the Duval monopoly.

All three past winners are expected to compete, including Scott and Elliott and, of course, Duval, going for his fifth straight in the Shrine 100.

The total purse for the seventh event has been hiked to \$7,500 with the
