# 'Legend' May Become Just That Among Movies

If Thomas Wolfe's statement "You Can't Go Home Again" is true, then Earl Owensby's "The Living Legend," the nearly one dozen films produced so far, is an equally true statement that life at the top can be dehumanizing.

"The Living Legend," the latest film from Shelby's EO Studios, and is far and away the best of

the nearly one dozen films produced so far.

"Legend" is mainstream, huge in scope and depth. It has high level performances dotting the lavish canvas, from the leads down through the supporting cast. The film shows firm control by young director Worth Keeter from Tom McIntyre's powerful script.

"Legend" is the story of an aging rock superstar's career finale. Earl Owensby displays a far wider emotional acting range as the troubled Eli Canfield - and his portrayal is a no holds barred portrait of how life at the top can dehumanize and destroy. Owensby's Eli is totally believable in its basically-decent-mangone-stray approach. It shows truth in that people idolized by millions can easily lose touch with the real world and real values.

As Gentleman Jim Cannon, Eli's personal manager, William Hicks is a man the audience loves to hate. His Gentleman Jim is ruthless; pushing, driving Eli toward collapse in his own search for total power behind the throne. Cannon's own personality has melded with Canfield's to the point he always refers to Eli's career as "Our career."

Ginger Alden, making her screen debut, turns in a well modulated performance as the girl who falls in love with Eli for himself and not what the world thinks he is. In one sequence Miss Alden also pleases the audience with a fine singing voice. She is that rare combination of true beauty and talent.

"Legend" is a solid drama with memorable musical numbers written and performed on the soundtrack by Roy Orbison and the Skywyro-Heegie Band. The band also appears in the film backing up Eli Canfield in actual concerts filmed in Asheville and Shelby.

The live concerts add even more excitement to the film as real audiences go wild over Eli Canfield and his-Orbison's music.

In the supporting ranks Kristian Reynolds turns in an emotion-packed performance as Susan Canfield, Eli's ex-wife. She and Owensby generate high-voltage sequences of the final breakup following a concert in Miami. And her final scene following the divorce is touching without a word being spoken.

Toby Wallace, Gentleman Jim's protégé, adds balance to Hicks' performance by serving as his devil's advocate in the continual push of Eli's career.

"The Living Legend" will be released by Pacific International Enterprises, either in August or December. It will appear in theatres all over the U.S. and the United Kingdom simultaneously.

If audience reaction elsewhere is anything like it was at the Capri last Thursday, Owensby will have a box office hit on his hands. And "Legend" could very well become just that.

## Rabies Clinics Are Set

The Cleveland County Health Department is sponsoring rabies vaccination clinics this week through May 19.

During this first week the clinics are being held in every township, conducted by veterinarians offices during office hours.

The vaccine will be given at a reduced rate of \$4 per injection. After the clinics the price will be \$5.

In this area the clinics are scheduled Sat., May 12 at Bethlehem Fire Department, 3-3:30 p.m.; Grover Schol, 3:45-4:15 p.m.; and West School, Kings Mountain, 4:30-5:30 p.m. Dr. Jerry Eskridge, local vet, is conducting these clinics.

State law requires that all dogs four months of age and over be vaccinated against rabies. Although cats are not required to be vaccinated, the health department recommends cat owners have them vaccinated as a safety precaution.
