Larry Milstead, missionary of The Wesleyan Church to Zambia, Africa, will speak at 7:00 p.m., Feb. 24, at the First Wesleyan Church, 500 N. Piedmont Ave., Kings Mountain.

A graduate of Central Wesleyan College, Central, South Carolina, University of North Carolina-Charlotte, and Appalachian State University, Milstead holds the Bachelor of Arts, Master of Arts and Education Specialist degrees.

Missionary Milstead's first team of service in Zambia began in 1979, where he has been engaged in teaching at Choma Secondary School, served as school pastor and been involved in village outreach.

Milstead will share interesting facts about the country, people and progress of the work in Zambia.

The Wesleyan Church serves in 34 countries, including Canada, Great Britain and the United States. While the major emphasis in the overseas outreach of the church is placed on gospel evangelism, an extensive medical and educational program has been carried on by

FIRST, THE GRAIN (USUALLY BARLEY OR RYE) HAD TO BE GROUND INTO MEAL, SIFTED TO FLOUR, THEN MIXED INTO A PASTE WITH WATER... NOW IT WAS KNEADED INTO DOUGH AND LEAVEN ADDED, LEFT STANDING LONG ENOUGH FOR IT TO RISE, THEN THE DOUGH WAS DIVIDED AND SHAPED INTO CAKES FOR BAKING. A FAMILY HAD ITS OWN PORTABLE OVEN OF STONE, WHICH STOOD ABOUT THREE FEET HIGH AND WAS HEATED ON THE INSIDE BY WOOD OR DRY GRASS FIRE, THE CAKES OF DOUGH BEING PASTERED ON THE OUTSIDE TO BE BAKED....

...USUALLY, IT WAS ONE OF THE YOUNGER DAUGHTERS OF THE HOUSEHOLD WHO SUPERVISED THE BAKING OF THE CAKES, FOR THEY HAD TO BE CAREFULLY TURNED DURING THE PROCESS LEFT ONE SIDE BE BURNT.
