Primary Will Likely **Be Delayed**

Primary elections, originally scheduled for May 4, will likely be delayed in North Carolina because of Senate re-districting.

The General Assembly, during a special session which ended February 11, adopted legislation directing the State Board of Elections to order the 1982 primary elections as well as setting the filing period for candidates for the U.S. Congress, State Senate and State House.

The State Board is required to order the primaries and filing period based upon the date on which three apportionment plans are approved by the U.S. Department of Justice, Elections Board director Alex K. Brock said.

"Unless there is practically immediate approval by the Justice Department, then it would seem reasonable that the primary will not be held earlier than June 1." Brock said.
