Finalists who become Presidential Scholars will be invited to Washington, D.C., where they will be hond by their elected representatives, by educators, and by others in public life. Selection is based on numerous factors in addition to academic excellence; for example, achievement in the visual and performing arts and creative writing; demonstrated leadership ability; contribution of energy and creativity to school and community; and achievement in the sciences and other fields of interest.
