Teresa Melton, Director of the Aging, said that any persons needing a ride to the fair may contact the Aging Program at 739-4511.

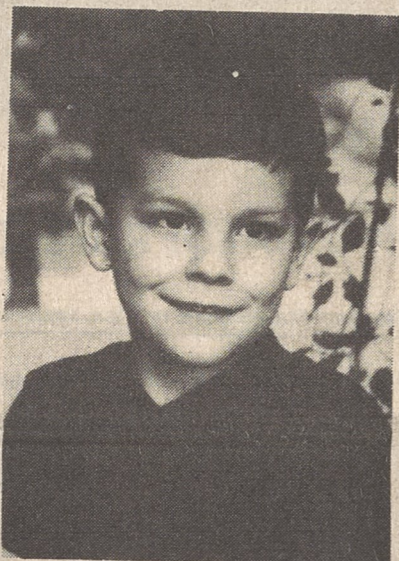

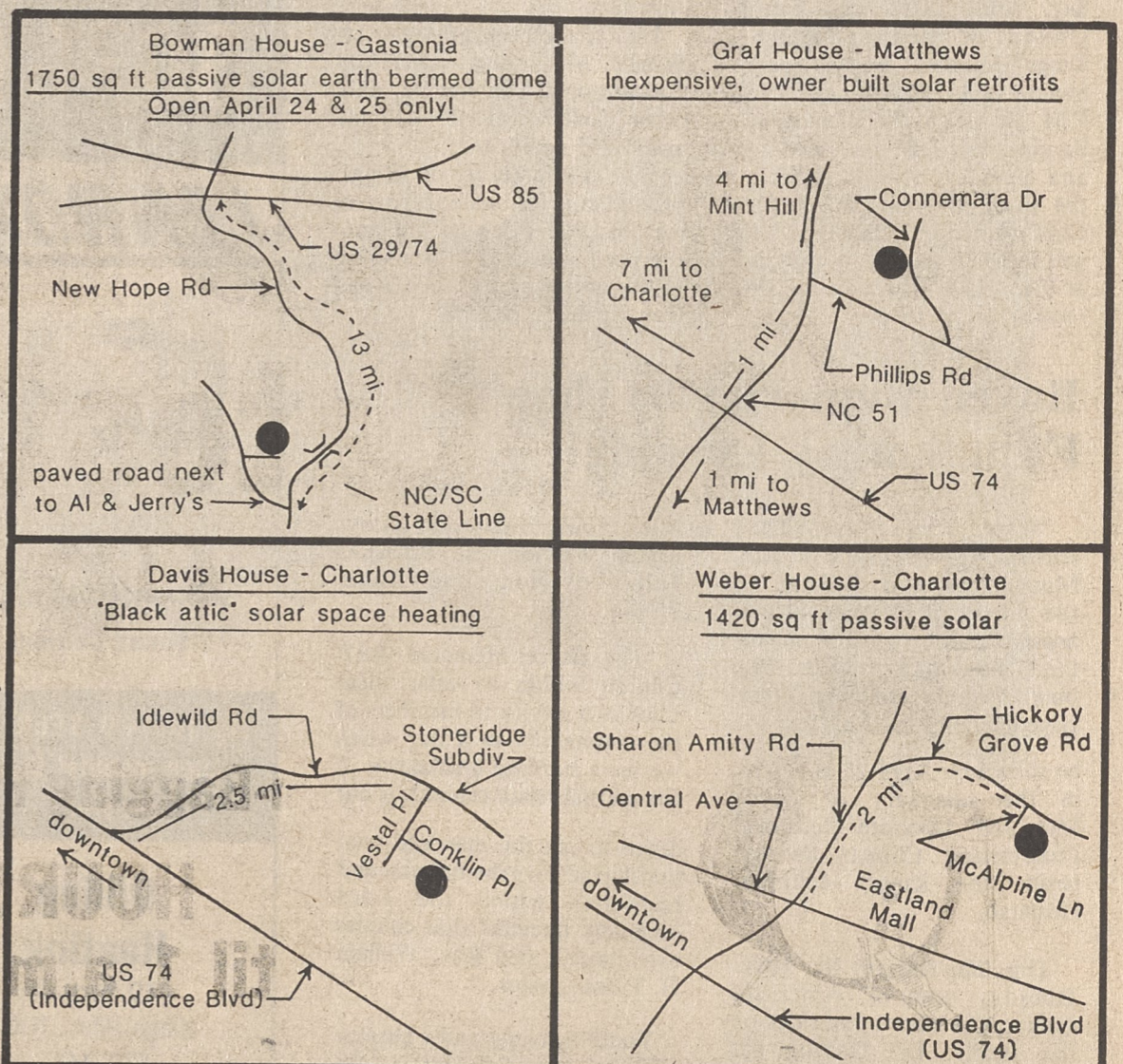
