Vacation Bible School will be held June 14-18 from 7 until 9 p.m. at Kings Mountain Baptist Church. There will be a class for every member of the family.

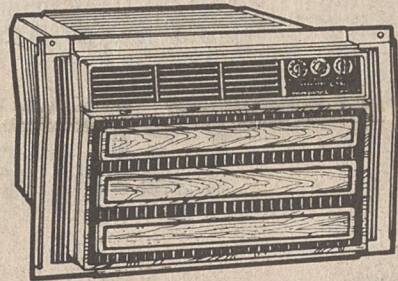
