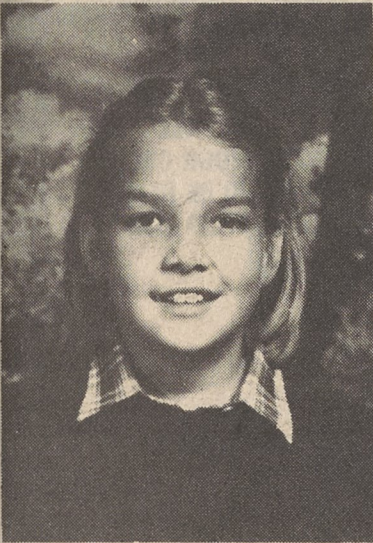
CAMERON FALLS

Mall's New Belk Store Hires 100 Employees

When the Belk store at Cleveland Mall opens August 4, 100 people will have jobs created by the new store.

"We've hired 100 full- and part-time employees to work at the new store, in addition to the 104 employees we already have," said Vice President and General Manager David Ellis. "At a time when unemployment is running so high in Cleveland County, we're happy to be able to offer these new jobs."

Ellis and his management staff have been hiring the new help over the last few weeks, and most available jobs have been filled. Some new employees will begin working in July, helping to prepare the store for its opening.

One reason for the additional employees is the larger size of the store. With more than 87,000 square feet of space, the Cleveland Mall store is more than twice the size of the Lafayette Street store.

"Another reason we need them is because the new store will be open longer, from 10 a.m. to 9 p.m. Monday through Saturday. There's no way we can have this kind of schedule without more help," Ellis said. Present hours are 9:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Monday-Thursday and Saturday, 9:30 a.m. to 8:30 p.m. Friday.

Forty-five of the new positions are full-time jobs, and the rest part-time. The new

employees will work in a variety of positions throughout the store, including sales, sales support, supervisory positions, and office help.

"We'll put each of the new employees through an intensive training session between now and the time we open. By August 4, they'll be well-trained and thoroughly able to handle the rush that always occurs when a new store opens," Ellis said.

Even long-time employees are receiving training to learn how to operate the new computerized cash register system the new store will have, Ellis said.

Ellis noted that the unemployment rate in Cleveland County has been running at 16 to 17 percent.

"Obviously we're not going to make a dent in the unemployment picture in Cleveland County with 100 jobs, but they're certainly a help during a time of bleak economic news. We believe the hiring expresses our faith in the basic soundness of the local economy. We know things are going to get better," he said.

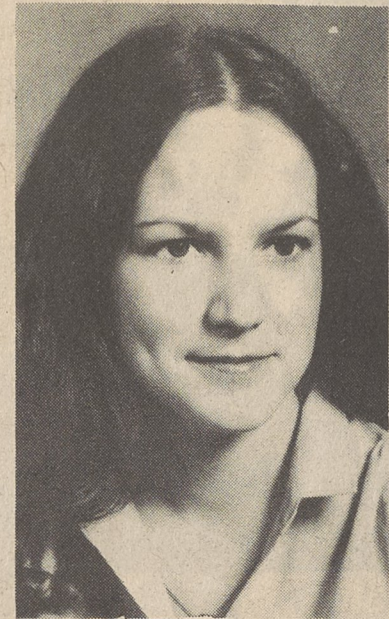
Scholarship Winner
