

Carmet Announces Layoff

The Kings Mountain economy took another dip last week when Carmet Industries of Kings Mountain announced a large layoff.

The company did not release the number of employees laid off but did say the plant "is operating with a skeleton crew."

The plant, which normally runs two shifts, is now operating only one.

"It is a temporary move and will be guided by the economy," a spokesman said.

The plant, which manufactures tools for the coal mining in-

dustry and civil engineering tools, had employed 120 production people and 45 salaried people.

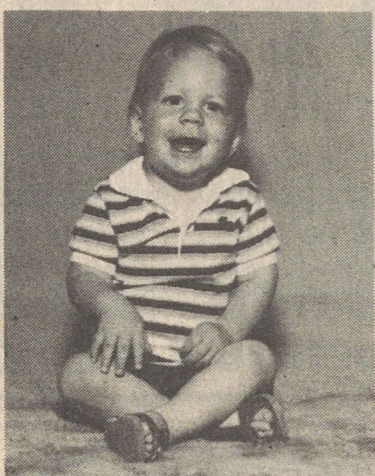

ford and 1,337 in Polk. Hunt had 9,839 in Cleveland, 4,480 in Rutherford and 1,281 in Polk. Owens had 4,728 in Cleveland, 5,760 in Rutherford and 830 in Polk. Wall had 5,201 in Cleveland, 3,544 in Rutherford and 622 in Polk. McBrayer had 3,904 in Cleveland, 1,986 in Rutherford and 460 in Polk, and Adams had 1,950 in Cleveland, 936 in Rutherford and 278 in Polk.

In tallying of the five Constitutional amendments, it appeared early Wednesday morning that Amendment One—a four-year term for members of the General Assembly—was defeated. Amendments Two (authorizing the General

Assembly to temporarily recall retired Supreme Court judges) and Three (giving the Supreme Court authority to review direct appeals from the N.C. Utilities Commission) appeared to be winning and Amendments Four (permitting the General Assembly to grant public bodies

powers to develop new and existing seaports and airports) and Five (permitting the GA to issue revenue bonds for construction of higher education facilities) were too close to call. Amendment four was about even and Five was winning by about three percent statewide.

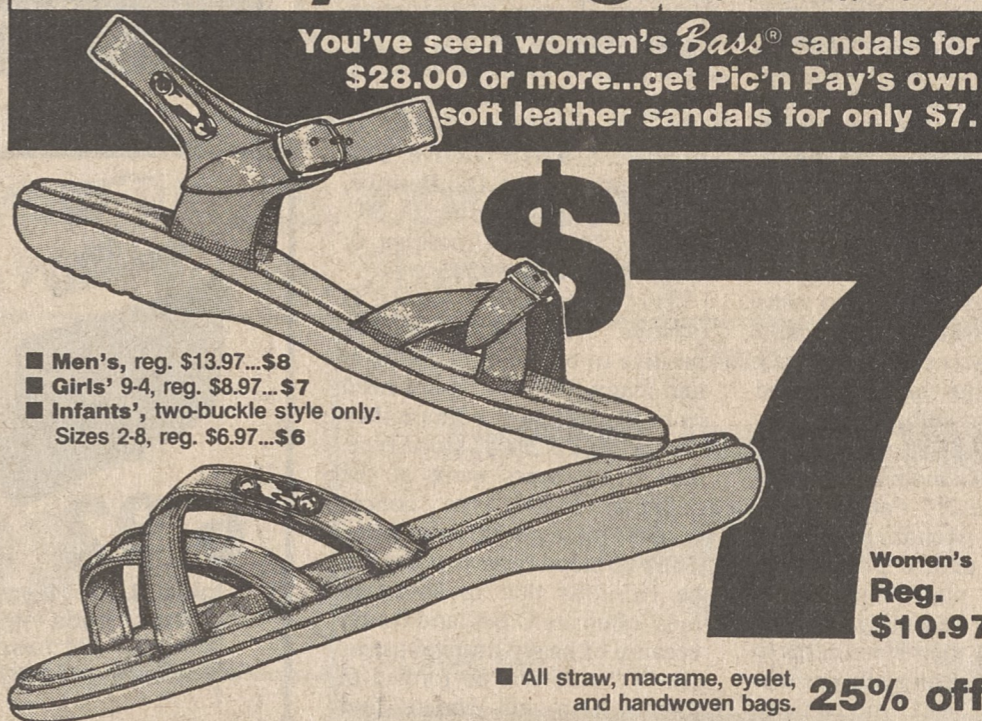

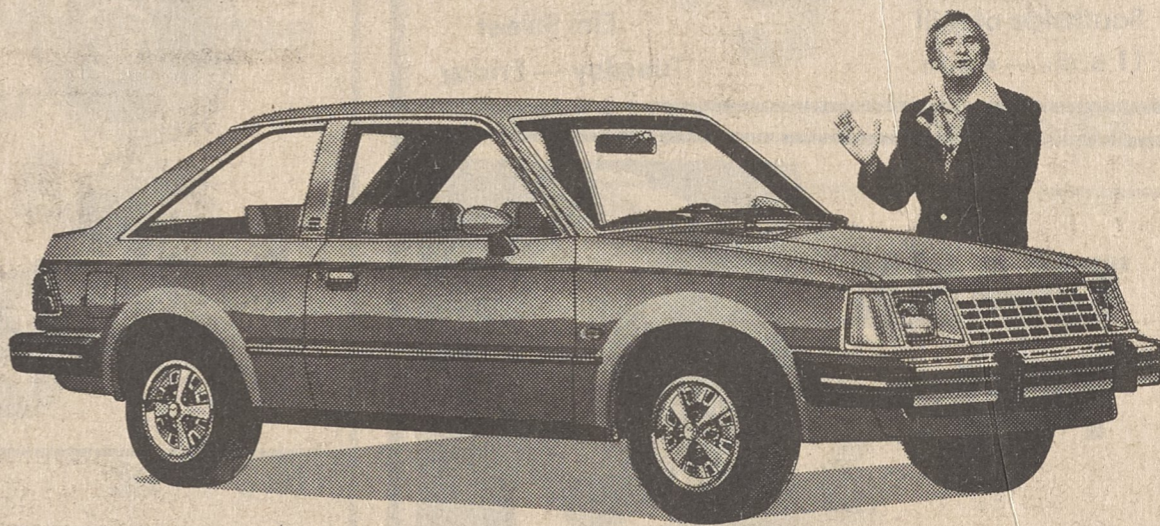
