KM Test Results Good

In the annual testing of Kings Mountain students in grades kindergarten through nine, the average scores led the 16 school systems in Educational Region VI in first grade reading, second grade reading and mathematics, and tied for first place in grade equivalent in third grade reading, Assistant Superinten-

dent Howard Bryant announced today.

Traditionally, Kings Mountain has been low in grades six and nine but those scores climbed also, Bryant said. The sixth grade reading scores were third in the region and ninth grade mathematics scores were sixth.

One of the goals of kindergarten is to develop readiness to read by the end of the year, Bryant noted. Eightyone percent of the kindergarten students achieved that goal.

The tests in grades four, five, seven and eight were given locally and may be compared to national tests rather than Region VI. Kings Mountain students average scores were ahead of the nation in all tests except eighth

grade math, Bryant said. "The students and their teachers should be praised for the success of their work on this year's standardized tests," he

Dr. Hyatt Is Rotary Governor

CULLOWHEE-Dr. Aaron Hyatt, of Cullowhee, assumed the office of Governor of Rotary District 767 this week. This District includes 31 counties in North Carolina in which there are 56 Rotary Clubs and over 3,300 Rotarians.
