The Council on the Aging of Cleveland County is sponsoring a senior citizens HEALTH FAIR, Monday, August 9, from 9 a.m. until 2 p.m. in the fellowship hall of the Shelby Presbyterian Church, 226 E. Graham Street.

The following services will be offered free of charge to all Cleveland County senior citizens by qualified personnel, skilled doctors, nurses and rescue emergency medical technicians who are all volunteering their time:

Kay Houlshouser will update information on hemacults and self breast exam to give us a better understanding about these matters so important to all of us.

Doctors will give foot examinations.

Blood pressures will be taken by volunteer nurses and rescue emergency medical technicians.

Screening for glaucoma, anemia, diabetes, time test (TB) will be given by Cleveland County Health Department nurses.

For those who may have questions about mental health, a qualified representative from the mental health department will be available.

For any health problem or questions qualified nurses from the community will provide counseling and referred.

A representative from home health will be present to answer questions and assist you with proper literature about your specific problems.

Frank Griffin, well known hearing defect expert in Cleveland County will give hearing tests, assisted by a member of the Sertoma Club.

Council on agings VIAL OF LIFE program will be represented by Mrs. Ezra Bridges and other volunteers who will also be happy to help you register for your senior Tar Heel Card.

Lynn Young of the Cleveland County mental health department will offer a miscellaneous health information display and will assist with questions.

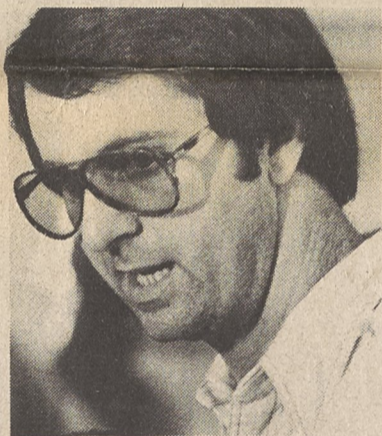
Ms. Libbie McKnight, executive director of the Council on the Aging of Cleveland County and her staff invite all senior citizens to attend this HEALTH FAIR.
