Congressman James T. Broyhill (R-NC) has announced his schedule for the 1982 Summer "Office Hours" tour throughout the 10th Congressional District.

The Lenoir representative will be in Kings Mountain at City Hall on Mon., Aug. 30th, from 2 until 3 p.m.

For a full week, Broyhill will be conducting meetings in various towns and cities throughout the district. The "office hours" tour, which Broyhill has scheduled every year since coming to Congress in 1962, will include over 20 stops in the representative's seven county area.

Usually conducting the tour in early August, Broyhill has explained that this year he has had to wait until the Labor Day recess to conduct his visits because of the heavy workloads in Congress.

"Work on the budget and the tax proposals have taken considerable time. I have attempted to work out a schedule so that I will not miss any of the work in Congress and still have plenty of time to visit and talk with the people back home" Broyhill said.

The visit by Broyhill allows people the opportunity to talk with him about problems they might be having with the different facets of federal government. Broyhill urges persons to come out and see him if they are having problems or wish to express their views or opinions. No appointments are necessary and people will be seen in the order they arrive.
