

The bride was given in marriage by her father. Judy Davis of Kings Mountain served as matron of honor and bridesmaids were Ina Blanton



Chastening Of The Lord

What does God mean in HEB 12:5, "...despise not thou the chastening of the Lord...". How does He chasten us? The same word that is translated "chasten" is also translated in the King James Version as "nurture" in Ephesians 6:4 and as "instruction" in 2 TIMOTHY 3:16.
