the self-service Plonk Shell Station.

*Authorized McCarter to place \$23,728.90 in federal reserve funds in higher-interest certificates. The funds are now in accounts paying 5 1/2 percent interest. McCarter is to put \$16,228 of the funds in a six-month money market certificate paying 9.737 percent, and \$7,500 in a 91-day certificate paying 7.801 percent.

*Passed a city ordinance forbidding reckless and destructive driving on a dirt road behind Spring Acres. Violators will be fined \$50.

*Approved a \$25 fine for persons caught using water from fire hydrants without the permission of the town clerk.

*Approved the purchase of four tires from Tillman's Firestone in Shelby at \$41.35 each.

*Authorized paying the city attorney \$250 retainer fee and \$60 to search a title of a lot the town recently purchased.

*Approved paying medical and clothing bills for Police Chief Jerry Randolph Kates.

*Approved payment of \$88 to E.E. "Shorty" McMurray for bushhog work.

*Was told by McCarter that the town had received \$807.65 from its insurance company to help replace a \$1,600 pump damaged by lightning.

*Was told by McCarter that the town had also received an insurance check to cover body work done on a damaged vehicle.
