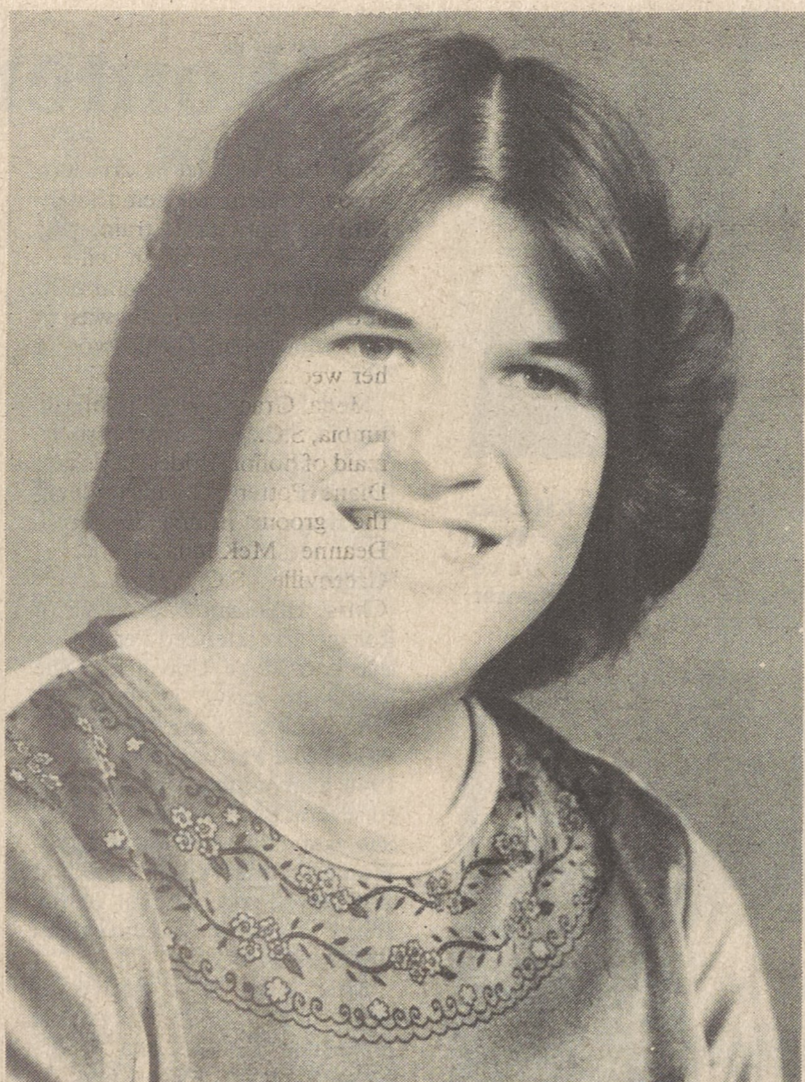




LOU CORAN MILLER

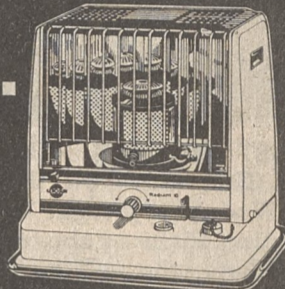

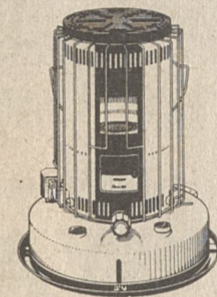
