Marchers To Arrive

The arrival of the Overmountain Marchers as they follow for the eighth successive year the 219 miles of the Overmountain Victory Trail will be the highlight of the 202nd Anniversary Celebration Program scheduled Thursday, October 7 at Kings Mountain National Military Park.

The colorful marchers, many dresed inclothing and bearing weapons similar to that of the pioneer frontiersman who defeated a major Brisish force during the Battle of Kings Mountain 202 years ago, will arrive at 3:00 p.m. at the National Military Park that today protects the historic Revolutionary War Battlefield.

The ceremonies will be keynoted by guest speaker General Carl D. Wallace, Adjutant General, Tennessee Army National Guard.

The Four-state historic route followed by the frontiersman of 1780 as they pursued and defeated their British foes was recognized two years ago as a Natinal Historic Trail and planning to preserve and mark original remaining segments of the trail continues.

Members of the Overmountain Victory Trail Associatin will be on hand to participate in the program which is open to the public and will be held at the park visitor center.
