Following a honeymoon trip to Jekyll Island and a tour of Florida, the newlyweds will reside in Charlotte.

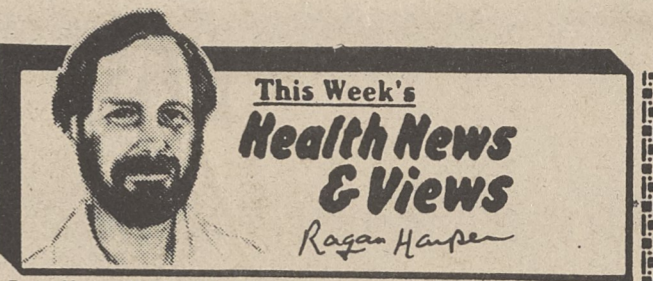
Lisa Hayes Is Honored

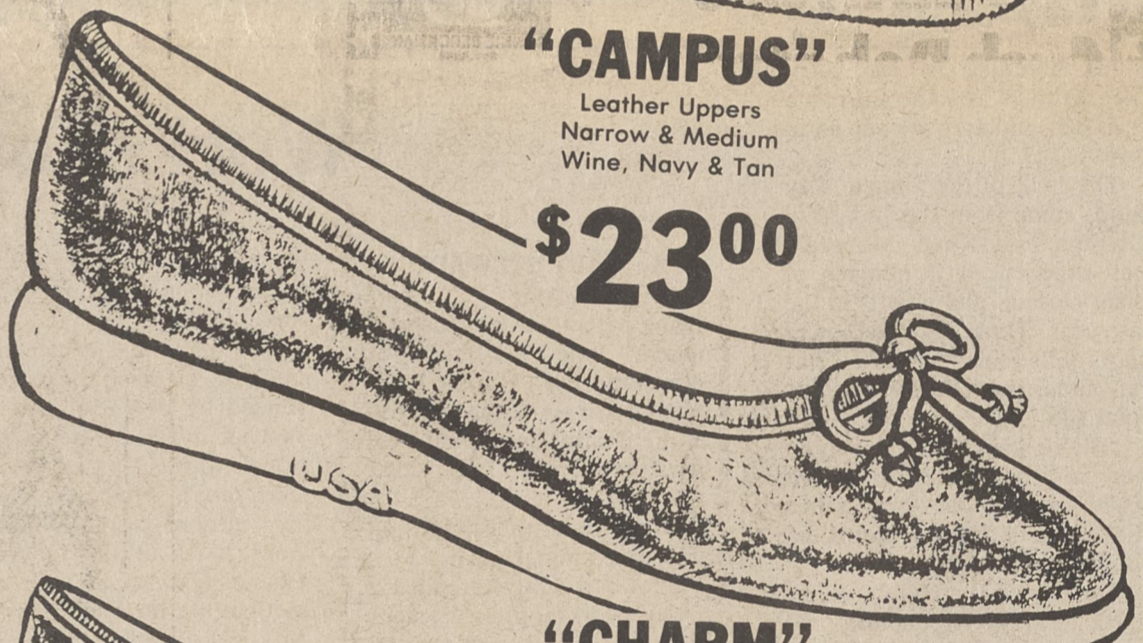
