Twelve-year-old Stuart Spires of Kings Mountain finished 20th in the one-mile fun run in the Charlotte Observer Marathon Saturday.

Stuart is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Millage Spires of Colonial Apartments.

The Central School sixth grader ran the course in six

minutes and 35 seconds. He was presented a red ribbon for his efforts.

The run was the third for Spires, who has been running for two years. He finished first in his age division in the last two West School Can Do Runs. He plans to participate in a fun run in

Wilmington in March. There were 369 runners in the event. Also participating from Kings Mountain were Daniel

"That was the fastest I've run the mile so far," he noted. "There were all age groups entered, up to 70 years old."

Bob Bolin led the winners with 12 points. Reggie Blalock had 11 for the losers.


In other games, Long Creek ran its record to 4-1 with a 78-58 win over First Wesleyan and Central Methodist edged First Baptist 38-36.

Kings Mountain High's wrestlers pulled off one of their biggest victories ever Thursday night at East Gaston, knocking off the Warriors 31-25 to break their 26-match winning streak.

The Warriors, who have won the past two Southwestern 3-A Conference championships, had not lost a home match in five years under Coach Doug Smith.

The East Gaston matters appeared to have their 27th consecutive victory locked up as they went into the final two matches with a 25-22 lead.

But Kings Mountain's Clinton Graham pulled a major upset over Gaston County Invitational champion Lloyd Mercks in the 195-pound match to tie the score at 25-all, and heavyweight Dale Moore of the Mountaineers pinned Bobby Kirkland in the final bout to swing the match in KM's



time Friday. East Gaston's girls, who scored their first win of the year, spent their entire Christmas vacation working on a game plan to stop the high-powered Mountainette attack. They couldn't stop Kings Mountain's talented senior center, Trina Hamrick, who had 19 points and 15 rebounds, but they did succeed in holding down everyone


Frank Parker scored 17 points and Lavar Curry 14 to lead the Mounties over East Gaston Tuesday.
