

Michelle Runner-Up

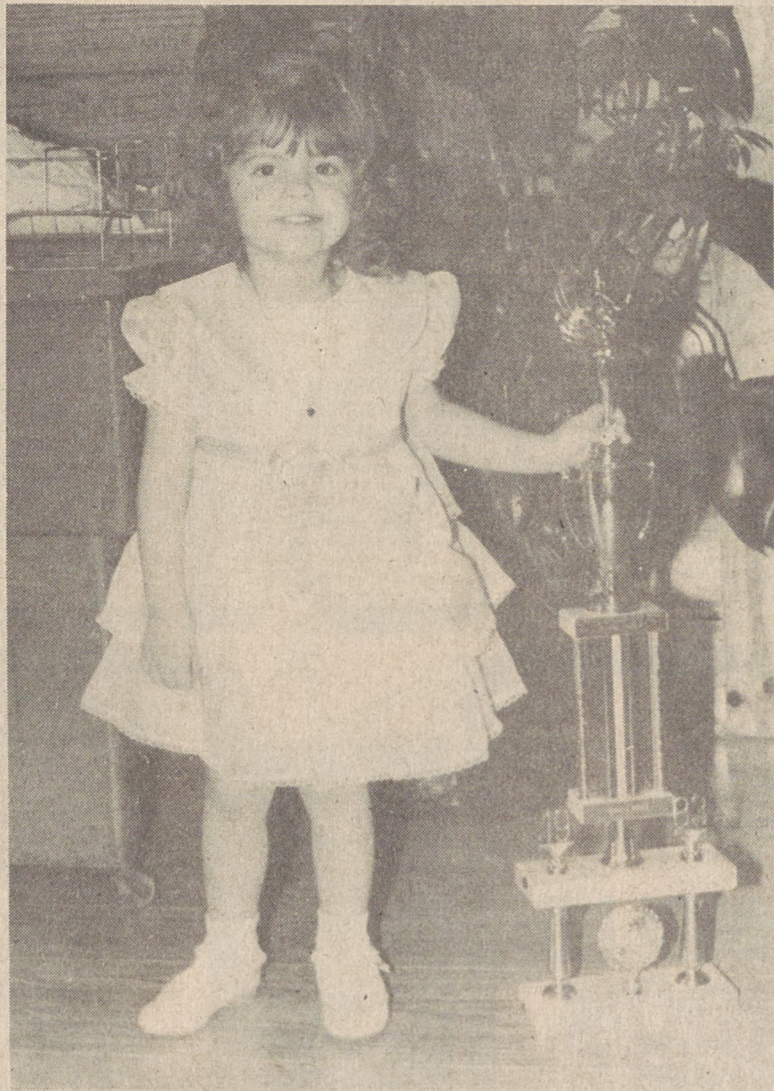

Mauney On Committee

Boiling Springs, NC...Five Cleveland County residents have been appointed to the newly formed Citizens Concerned for Higher Education Committee.

They are Marie Martin, director of financial aid at Gardner-Webb College and Craig Meadows, president of the Student Government Association at G-W; W.K. Mauney Jr. of Kings Mountain, Marjorie Hoyle Rogers and Clyde Stutts of Shelby.

Citizens Concerned for Higher Education is a statewide committee of 400 who will work with the General Assembly to

assure that the best possible system of Higher education is maintained in North Carolina. Members of the committee were selected by colleges and universities across the state.

The group's highest priority for the current legislative session is an increase in the amount of state aid provided to the 24,000 North Carolina students attending the state's 38 independent colleges and universities.

Currently the state grants \$850 for each state resident attending an independent institution. The General Assembly has been asked to raise that allocation to \$1,025 for 1983-84 and to \$1,200 for 1984-85.

Former N.C. Supreme Court Justice David Britt, one of the committee's co-chairman, said the additional aid is needed to assure that all students have a choice in the type of education program that best meets their needs.

Rhea Is Named VP-GM

Roman L. Anyzeski, Chairman of the Board of Raco Manufacturing, has announced the promotion of Ronald W. Rhea to the position of Vice President General Manager.

"The major bulk of our die casting operations are in sporting goods - golf putters, metal bows, metal wood head for many major golf companies," Rhea said. He is son of Clara and Bob Rhea of Kings Mountain. Rhea is married to Pattie Mooney. He is a KMHS graduate and attended Lenior Rhyme College.

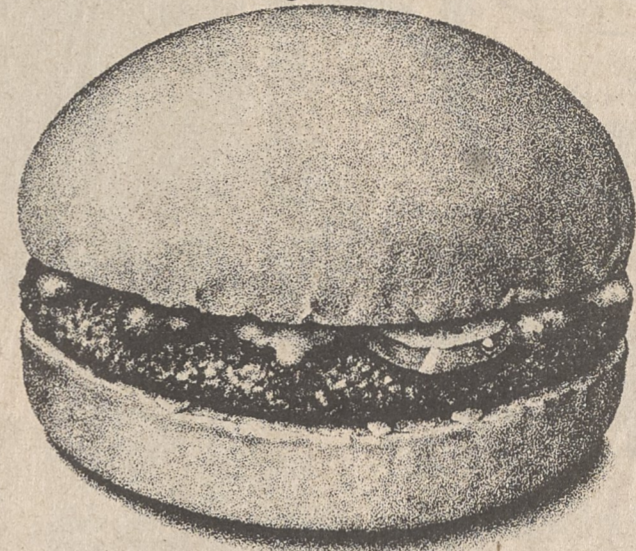

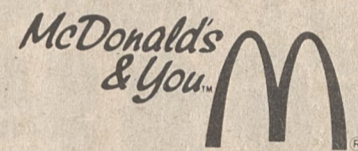

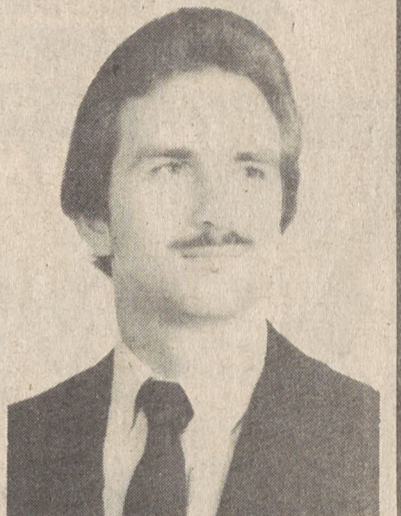
