Two of these rare antelope type creatures are at their new home in the North Carolina Zoo, courtesy of the Telephone Pioneers.

The sitatunga is a rather shy creature that stands 40 inches tall and weighs 200 pounds, and is also known as the marsh buck. If often submerges in water entirely, with only the tip of its snout protruding above the surface.
