Student Awarded Scholarship

GREENSBORO—Amy Susan Hull of Fallston has been awarded a Katharine Smith Reynolds Scholarship to attend the University of North Carolina at Greensboro this fall.

The Reynolds Scholarship winners were announced today by the UNC-G Competitive Scholarships Committee, which selected 12 recipients from the 40 finalists in the competition. Overall, there were approximately 200 applicants from throughout North Carolina for the awards.

Scholarship recipients were selected on the bases of superior academic achievement and potential, evidence of moral force of character, qualities of leadership and interest in others—and motivation toward useful purposes in life.

Miss Hull, a senior at Burns Senior High School, is the daughter of Dr. and Mrs. Willis B. Hull of Box 309, Fallston.

At Burns High School, Miss Hull is serving as president of the National Honor Society and secretary of the Student Council. In addition, she is a member of the National French Honor Society, the French Club, the Beta Club, the Keywanettes and a guidance assistant at her high school.

During the past year, she has served as a Governor's page, a delegate to the district Beta Club Convention and as a delegate to the North Carolina Student Council Convention. She also was the recipient of a Daughters of the American Revolution "good citizenship" award.

At UNC-G, Miss Hull plans to major in nursing.

The amount of a Reynolds Scholarship is now \$1,500 per year. The scholarships are renewable for three additional years of undergraduate study beyond the freshman year. Thus, over four years, a Reynolds Scholarship would be worth up to \$6,000.

Soil Stewardship Week Set In Cleveland County

The Cleveland Soil and Water Conservation District will join the nationwide celebration of Soil Stewardship Week to take place on May 8-15, according to an announcement by Sam Jenkins, Chairman of Cleveland Soil and Water Conservation District. The theme of this year's celebration is "Living Waters." The National Association of Conservation Districts (NACD)

has sponsored Soil Stewardship Week since 1955, in cooperation with the nation's nearly 3,000 soil and water conservation districts.

"If our water management practices in the past have been adequate, we may ignore the rising population, the increased industrialization, and expanded irrigation, all of which require more water from our reservoirs,"

citis NACD in this 16-page Soil Stewardship Week booklet. "One of our more compelling social and economic needs is for a full appreciation of the true value of our abundant supply of water. It is time to think seriously about conservation, pollution, priority usage and our dependence upon it."

Informative material on the Soil Stewardship Week theme is

distributed each year through local conservation districts to clergymen, lay leaders, churches, civic and educational organizations and to individuals participating in the observance.

"If we are to make certain that supplies will be adequate for present and future needs, we are obligated to abide by the universal laws and to help, rather than

hinder, the process by which the constant supply of water is recycled and repurified," according to NACD.
