# **Firemen Need Help**

The Chesnut Ridge Fire Department is facing financial and manpower problems, stated Cindy Milling during its Tuesday night board meeting. She added that the fire department is not being supported by the public the way it should be.

The fire department, started and organized in May 1980, consists of the concrete structure, two fire trucks, one being leased from Grover and the other purchased from Rowan County, and one water truck, donated by Patterson Oil Company.

One reason stated by Milling that the public is not aiding the department is that members of the community are confused as to what fire district they are located in.

The monthly expenses for the fire department average \$500 which includes building, utlities, and equipment. To combat the financial difficulties the department will hold a car wash, begin-
