Red Man Tourney Set At Santee

CHARLESTON, S.C.—Bass anglers in the Carolina Division of the Red Man Tournament Trail will descend on Santee-Cooper Lakes Aug. 14 in pursuit of cash prizes and the last seasonal shot at qualifying for the circuit's yearend championship.

A field of approximately 175 anglers is expected for the event to be fished out of Goat Island Marina on Santee-Cooper, which is actually two joined lakes, Lake Marion and Lake Moultrie. A purse of more than \$6,500 is expected to be on the line. The winner's helping is expected to top \$2,100.

The last of six tournaments in the Carolina Division for 1983, the Santee-Cooper contest will tell the tale as to which competitors in the division will earn free berths in the Red Man All

American Bass Championship.

The Red Man Tournament Trail, geared for "working man" bass anglers, features 10 divisions of competition in 11 states. Each division offers a series of six \$50-entry-fee, one-day tournaments affordable for weekend warrior competitors. But prizes stay healthy through a policy of returning 100% of entry money in the form of cash awards along the trail.

Purses are guaranteed by supporting sponsors Ryobi America Corp., Humminbird by Techsonic, Mann's Bait Co. and Stroh Brewery Co. A minimum winner's prize of \$1,000 is guaranteed at each event, but prizes have hit figures far larger due to heavy tournament fields.

The Santee-Cooper tournament also will be the Carolina anglers last chance to earn

points. The high point angler in the Carolina division and each of the other nine divisions will earn \$1,000 from OMC—\$500 from Evinrude motors, \$500 from Johnson outboards.

The biggest payoffs, however, come in the All American Oct. 18-22 on Kentucky Lake/Lake Barkley in western Kentucky. The top 24 Carolina anglers qualify for this no-entry-fee, high stakes contest.

At the All American, the Carolina qualifies fish among themselves for two days. The winner of this round earns a new bass boat from Ranger of Arkansas, while second and third places pay with fat cash prizes. All of the qualifiers will earn a check of some amount.
