BOILING SPRINGS, N.C.—The B.E. Morris Academy for Christian Studies at Gardner-Webb College will begin sponsoring a series of classes for persons in the community who are interested in learning more about the Bible or about music.

SHOW AND DANCE

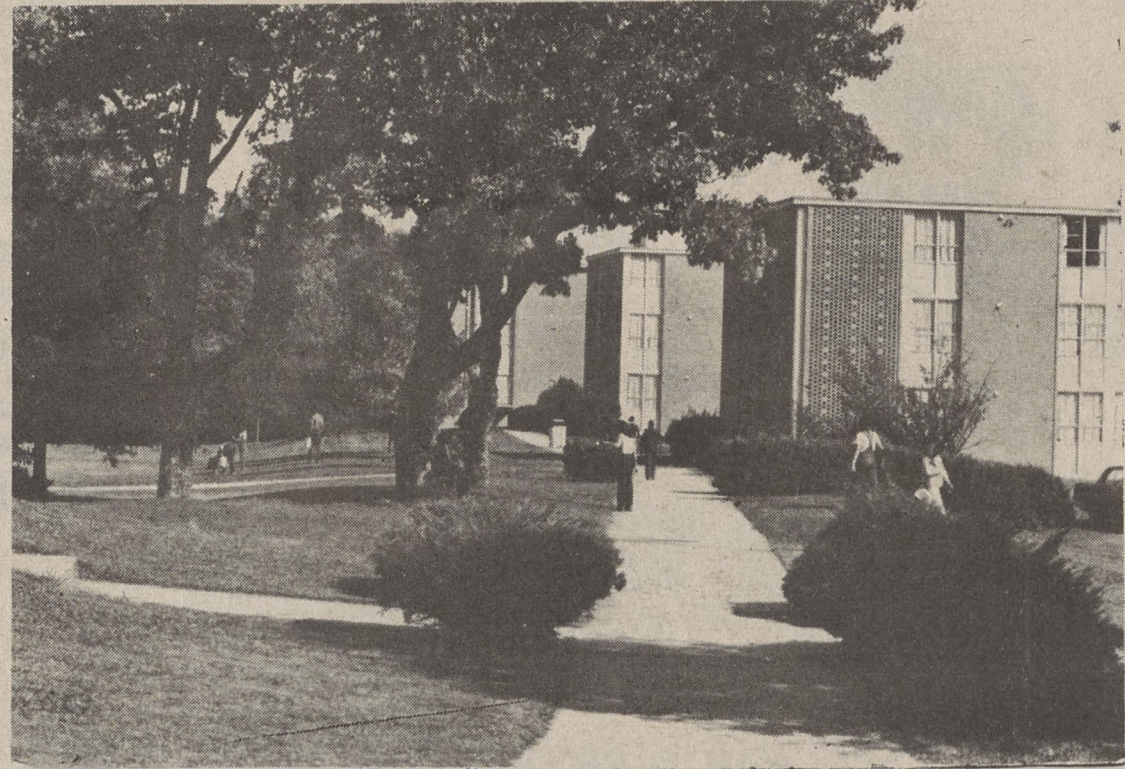

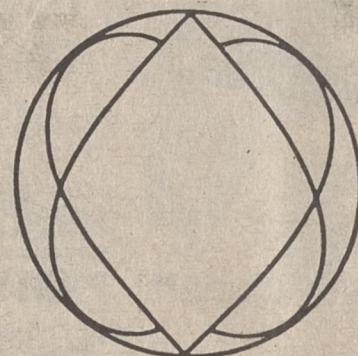
