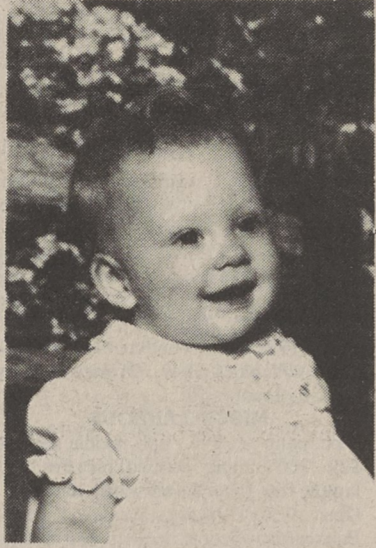


Heather's First Birthday

Her mother is the former Debbie Cooke from Kings Mountain.

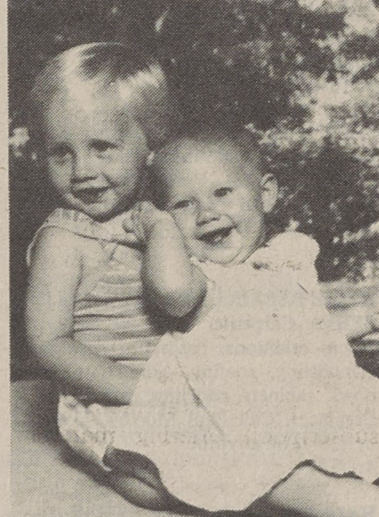

Kings Mountain's first bloodmobile visit for the 1983-84 fiscal year will be Thurs., Sept. 15 from 12:30-6 p.m. at First Baptist Church.

It's tagged the Kings Mountain industrial and community visit. The goal is 225 pints.

Other visits for this year are Wed., Nov. 16 at Kings Mountain High School, Thurs., Mar. 8, Thur., May 8 at KMHS and Thur., June 28.

Seventy donors from Kings Mountain earned VIP status last year. To be a VIP, one must give blood at least four times a year. Mauney Hosiery of Kings Mountain is the only industry in the county working in the VIP program.

There is an urgent need for blood types O-positive, O-negative, B-negative and B-positive. Persons with those blood types are urged to give blood somewhere this week and next.
