Mars Hill College To Honor KM Native

MARS HILL-Mars Hill College will honor Asheville Citizen columnist Bob Terrell and four other educators for their contributions to the college and the region during the school's annual Founders' Day celebration Tuesday, October 4.

According to Mars Hill's president, Dr. Fred Bently, "These five friends have gone out of their way to be of assistance to us and in publicly honoring them, we would like to share with the larger community the many contributions they have made to the college."

Founders' Day recognized the several men who joined together to establish Mars Hill College in 1856 and supported it through its initial years. The celebration of the school's beginning has been traditionally scheduled on or near October 12, the birthday of Edward Carter, contributor of the land on which the college was established.

Robert Bryson (Bob) Terrell, who will also be the main speaker for the morning's activities, is a native of Western North Carolina, born and reared in Sylva. He joined the Asheville Citizen's sports department in 1949, two years before he finished his undergraduate degree at Western Carolina Teachers College. He became sports editor in 1956, news editor in 1967, and associtate editor in 1972. He

began writing his general interest column in 1967.

Terrell has won several awards during his career, including the N.C. Press Association's award for feature writing, an Association Press award in their annual enterprise story contest, and was the 1980 recipient of the WNC Historical Association's achievement award for "Grandpa's Town," a book about Asheville during the period from 1900 to World War I. He has authored six other books, traveled extensively in the Middle East and Europe, and has been a member of the Billy Graham team since 1977.

Four high school guidance counselors will also reveive distinguished service award for their efforts in recruiting student for Mars Hill. They include Mrs. Pauline Wright Putnam, who recently retired from Central Cabarrus School in Concord. A native of Kings Mountain, she is a gradiate of Mars Hill, Class of 1939. She continued her studies at Western Carolina University and earned her master's degree from UNC-Chapel Hill. She is a member of Mars Hill's Board of Advisors and president of an alumni chapter in her area. Her other activities include membership in the Alpha Delta Kappa Soroity, the Business and Professional Women's Club, the N.C. Association of Educators, the Association of Psychological Examiners, the Home Extension Agency, and the McGill Baptist Church where she has been a Sunday School teacher and held several offices in the Women's Missionary Society.

Mrs Maxcine Shope Williams is director of the federal programs and community schools for Graham County. She is a Robbinsville native and earned her undergraduate and master's degree from Western Carolina University. In her dual role, she seeks grants to promote the humanities and cultural events such as the recent Smokey Mountain Heritage Festival as well as assisting the community to utilize the public school

facilities for community events ranging from pre-school to senior citizens activities. She is a member of over 25 different committees and organizations including the WNC Tomorrow Board of Directors, NC 2000 chairperson for Graham County, the Governor's Highway and Transportation Commission, the Governor's Council for Job Training, the Planning Board for the new public library in Robbinsville, and a member of the Mountain Creek Baptist Church.

Mrs. Cheryl Buchanan Pappas has been a guidance counselor at Independence High School in Charlotte for the past five years. A 1979 graduate of Mars Hill, she earned her master's degree from UNC-Charlotte. At Mars Hill, she was a majorette, first runner up in the Miss Laurel contest, and a member of the student activities board. She was also Miss Newland and represented Avery, Mitchell, and Yancey Counties in the Miss N.C. Contest in 1970. A native of Newland, she served as organist for the Newland First Baptist Church until recently when she and her family became members of the Providence Baptist Church in Charlotte.

Mrs. Ruth Barton Pullium was a guidance counselor at Andrews High School for 16 years and retired last year to form a private educational counseling service for high school students. While a member of the Andrews High Staff, she received a special commendation from the state's educational department for her work there in which scholarship money for Andrews High Students never fell below \$500,000 during her 16 years there. A native of Marble, she earned both her undergraduate as well as her master's degree
