

# Computer Courses Set

DALLAS, NC ... The continuing Education Division of Gaston College will sponsor three Computer Programming Basic Language Courses. The classes will be conducted at South Point High School in Belmont on Mondays from 4 p.m. until 6 p.m., October 10 through January 30 and on Tuesday, from 4 p.m. until 6 p.m. on October 11 through January 31.

The basic language course will be held at North Gaston High

School in Dallas on Mondays from 6:30 p.m. until 8:30 p.m. on October 10 through January 30.

The third location is Hunter Huss High School. The basic language course will be conducted on Mondays from 6:30 p.m. until 8:30 p.m. on October 10 through January 30 and on Tuesday from 4 p.m. until 6 p.m. on October 11 through January 31.

5 into the line (Plott). McManos' pass to Left End Bobby Abercrombie fell incomplete. Wyke took a pitchout from McManos and raced 53 yards to the KM 5 (Layton) but MH was called for clipping on the KM 24 and penalized 125 to the KM 39, a 34 yard gain on the play and a first down. McManos faded back to the KM 45 and threw a 50 yard pass that Right End Benny Carpenter gathered in on the KM 5 and hauled over for a score. Wyke converted from placement, McManos holding to tie the game. Score—KM 7, MH 7.

Tackle Joe Huffstetler kicked off to the KM 10 to Patterson who came back 13 yards (Couthen) as the period ended.

**Second Quarter**  
Ruth slipped over left guard for 6 (Moore) and D. McCarter ran a reverse for 8 (Patterson) and a first down. Kimmell passed to Left End Murel Valentine for 8 (Richardson) Kimmell hit tackle for 8 (Huffstetler) and a first down of the MH 47. D McCarter lost 3 on a reverse (Couthen). Kimmell hit the line for 5 and punted to the MH 5 to McManos who came back 7 (Hudson).

Richardson went over guard for a gain that was cancelled when MH drew 5 for backfield in motion. Fullback Gantt picked up 3 (Ruth and Plott) and Wyke went around right end for 2 (Ruth and Patterson). Wyke made 1 into the line (Layton and Kimmell) and McManos punted to the KM 49 to Kimmell who was stopped in his tracks (Abercrombie).

D. McCarter made 3 on a reverse (Betty). Kimmell picked

up 8 on a play cancelled, both sides drawing penalties. Patterson hit guard for 7 & Couthen) and a first. Kimmell made 4 but KM drew 15 for illegal use of the hands. D. McCarter made 1 (Abercrombie) on a reverse. Kimmell's pass to Patterson fell incomplete, a KM backs-in-motion penalty being refused. McManos intercepted Kimmell's pass on his 42 and ran back 2 (Patterson).

McManos' pass to Richardson fell incomplete. D. McCarter intercepted another McManos toss intended for Carpenter on the KM 25 and ran 20 yards to the KM 40 (Beatty) as the half ended. Score—KM 7, MH 7.

**Third Quarter**  
Huffstetler kicked to the KM 25 to Plott who came back 12 yards (Carpenter). Kimmell made 1 in the line (Sigmon) and Patterson lost a yard (Sigmon). Kimmell made 6 over guard (Wyke) and punted out-of-bounds on the MH 40.

Richardson made 2 (Plott and Ruth) but Gantt fumbled, Hudson recovering for the Mountaineers on the MH 41.

Kimmell made 2 (Couthen and Huffstetler). Kimmell's pass fell incomplete. D. McCarter made 5 (Couthen) on a reverse but fumbled, Huffstetler recovering on the MH 38. Wyke hit tackle for 1 (Hullender) and Richardson added 1 at left end (Hullender). McManos passed to Abercrombie for 4 (Patterson, on a hard tackle). McManos punted to Kimmell on the KM 20, D. McCarter taking a handoff for 4 yards (Abercrombie, on a shoe-string).

Kimmell passed to Ruth for 16 and a first (Wyke). Kimmell went over right tackle for 4 (Huffstetler). Ruth was stopped for minus 1 by the left side of the MH line. Kimmell hit right tackle for 3 (Huffstetler) and punted to the MH 20, but both sides were called for rules infractions. Kimmell's punt rolled backward from the MH 28, hit Couthen on the MH 28, R. Davis recovering for KM. Kimmell hit right tackle for 5 (Davis) as the period ended.

**Fourth Quarter**  
D. McCarter made 2 (Moore on a reverse and Kimmell made the first down with 4 at right guard (Wyke and Miller). Patterson hit the line for 4 (Huffstetler) and Ruth bulled through for 6 (Huffstetler) and a measured first on the MH 7. Kimmell went off right tackle for the score and kicked the point after from placement, Ruth holding. Score—KM 14, MH 7.

Tackle Sam McCarter kicked out-of-bounds on the first try, to the MH 30 on the next, Richardson making only 1 on the run back (Arnette and Layton). Wyke fumbled for a big loss but KM drew 5 for off-

sides. McManos lost 4 at tackle (Hudson). McManos' pitchout was fumbled for a 8 yard loss (Caveny). D. McCarter knocked down McManos' long toss to Carpenter on the KM 46 and, on a punt try, the center snap went over McManos' head for an 11 yard loss (K. Davis) and KM took over on the MH 13.

Ruth made 7 over guard (McManos) and Patterson added a yard, cancelled as KM drew 5 for backs-in-motion. Kimmell hit tackle for 6 (Batchelor) and made the first down with 4 (Carpenter and Richardson) to the MH 1. Patterson failed to gain (Miller and Richardson) and Kimmell slipped over for the score. Kimmell's placement try for point was wide to the left. Score—KM 20, MH 7.

K. Davis kicked to the KM 25 to Wyke who came back 11 (Marlowe). McManos fumbled and recovered for a loss but KM took a 5 yard penalty against MH for off-sides. McManos passed to his left to Couthen, who lateraled to Wyke for 48 yards (Center Milton HOPE, Jr.). McManos passed to his right to Wyke, who lateraled to Couthen for 11 yards and a first down on the KM 10. Batchelor made 5 into the line (Hudson), Wyke 2 at center (R. Davis) and McManos' pass to Carpenter in the end zone was incomplete (D. McCarter). The center of the KM line held McManos to a yard on a sneak and KM took over on the KM 2 as the game ended. Final score—KM 20, MH 7.
