Letter To Editor

To The Editor:

This letter is designed to make the public aware of dangers in state school bus transportation that are made much worse by what is in my opinion a grotesquely corrupt court system.

It is very dangerous and also a violation of a state law for a vehicle to pass a stopped school bus which has the stop sign out and blinker lights flashing.

Recently as I was loading a child in a wheel chair into my bus in Kings Mountain, a woman ran by my bus. The stop sign was out and the lights blinking.

I turned her tag number and other description over to a Kings Mountain police officer who wrote the woman a citation and she was summoned to court.

In court I was quizzed-even harassed-about things such as the size of the letters on my bus which I stated was eight inches high. I was asked if I had measured the letters.

The arresting officer testified that the woman admitted that she proceeded by the bus while the stop arm was out.

A lawyer asked the judge to dismiss the case for lack of identification of the driver. Why would the lawyer ask for such as this when the woman had already admitted she ran by the stop sign?

The judge then dismissed the case.

A citizen has little hope of seeing the law upheld against a system of courts and lawyers that prevent the laws from being carried out by failing to bring law breakers to justice.

I am only twenty-three years of age and this is the very first experience I have had concern-

ing the United States Court System and it puts me in a state of shock.

I explained my experience to an older person who said "Robin, welcome to The United States." In essence he said that that's just the way it is.

Since the courts will not cooperate in carrying out the law, I would like to plead with the motoring public-please help to make school bus transportation safe-please stop for buses while they are loading or unloading. You could save a life.

Health Hints

If you get a blister when running, don't break it. Put petroleum jelly on it. If the blister is severe, stop running until it heals—do some other form of exercise.

To avoid getting a stitch in your side when you run,



don't run on an empty stomach. Eat something before you run...tea and toast is good.

If you injure your Achilles tendon, apply cold, not heat. All competitors in the Colgate Women's Games who have tendon injuries put their feet in a small bucket of ice for 15 minutes at a time.

If you come down with shin splints, treat it with ice. Freeze water in a paper cup and rub it up and down your leg for 15 minutes at a time. As the ice melts, just peel back the paper of the cup. To avoid the problem, try not to run continually on a very hard surface.
