Authorization was given to advertise for bids for a comminutor for the Northwoods Pump Station. A motion carried for curb and gutter street improvements from Margaret Street to Stowe Acres.

The board also granted a re-

quest from Robert E. and Betty Sue K. Morris to establish and develop a trailer park on 17 acres of land located on Highway 216, on the land owned by Hal W. and Letha B. Morris.

The board also authorized the sale of surplus property and material, such as used vehicles. In other business they approved the final canvassing of the municipal elections held recently and passed a resolution declaring

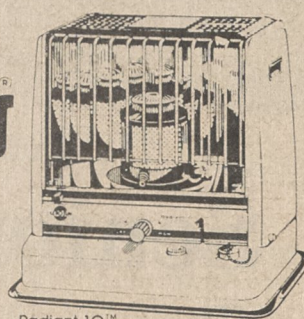
