If I had to answer why I did it, I'd say it was because I needed a diversion from what I was doing. My children and grandchildren all think it's great."

Ruey has been a native of Kings Mountain for the past 50 years. She is the widow of the late Yates F. Throneburg. She has two sons, James who lives in New York and Bill who lives in

Salt Lake City and two grandchildren who've finished college, Patricia Ann and William F. Throneburg.

Aside from cooking, sewing, and flower gardening there is no end to Ruey's hobbies. She is also an active member of Central Methodist Church.

Once the book is complete, she plans to discard all the drawers full of recipes. When asked if she planned to publish any more books she said she was through collecting recipes. But then a little glimmer came into her eyes, "Well, I do have an extensive collection of yeast bread recipes, who knows, it all depends on how this project goes."

Once the book is released it will be sold locally. Copies may be purchased for \$4.95 and may also be obtained through Ruey or Herald Publishing House. Currently there is a long list of good cooks waiting for the book's release.
