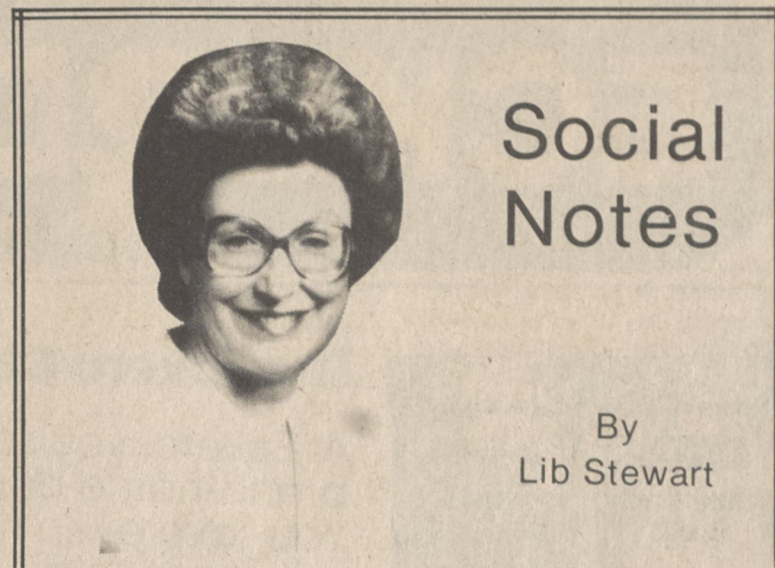
Southern Arts Society is seeking a logo—please take any ideas to the Art Show also. A vote will choose the logo for the group.
