## **Kevin Mack Signs** With L.A. Express

Kings Mountain's Kevin Mack last week signed a professional football contract with the Los Angeles Express of the United States Football League.

Mack is currently working out with the Express and hopes to see playing duty within the next week.

The terms of Mack's contract were not disclosed. James Robinson, a teammate of Mack's at Clemson University, also signed with the Express and the two are sharing an apartment in Los Angeles.

Mack's mother said the former KMHS student went to L.A. last Wednesday to talk with the Express management, and signed on Friday.

Mack had a sensational senior season last fall for Clemson, which won its third straight Atlantic Coast Conference title. A 197-pound fullback, Mack led the team in rushing with 862



yards, the most ever for a Clemson fullback, and had the highest carry-per-yard rushing average of any back in the ACC

He had three 100-plus yard games, including a career high of 187 yards in a 52-14 victory over Maryland which clinched the ACC title.

Mack was the starting fullback in the 1982 Orange Bowl game when Clemson defeated Nebraska 22-15 for the national championship.


At Kings Mountain High, where he played under Coach Dan Brooks, Mack broke the single season and single game rushing records his senior year. His game record was 287 yards against R-S Central, and his career record was 1,585 yards.

Mack becomes the second Kings Mountain High football player to play pro football. Pride Ratterree, a lineman at KMHS in the 1930's, played with the Chicago Bears in the National Football League. Ratterree played his college ball at Wake Forest and later coached on the collegiate and college level.
