Pre-School Screening Set In KM

A team of teachers, speech therapists, the school nurse, the school social worker, and the principal will conduct pre-school screening sessions for all children who will enter kindergarten this coming school year and their parents. To be eligible, the child must be five years old on or before October 15, 1984 and must be a resident of the Kings Mountain school district. Registration is currently taking place at each of the five elementary schools.

The screening sessions are being planned for 15 students at one time. The first group will begin at 8:30 a.m., the second at 10:30 a.m., and the last at 1:30 p.m. Parents should contact the school in their district to secure a registration form and make an appointment for the screening which is on a first-come, firstserved basis. If the parent does not know which school his child will attend, he should call the District School Office at 739-4580 for that information.

Screening sessions will be held as follows:

North School, April 30 and May 1; East School, May 2 and 3; Grover School, May 7 and 8; Bethware School, May 9 and 10; West School, May 14 and 15.

Parents will need to bring the child's official birth certificate (not the hospital record), his upto-date immunization record, and a copy of his/her physical examination by the family doctor or the health department.


