

Athlete Of Week

Former Kings Mountain High athlete Priscilla Rickenbacker was named Athlete of the Week last week at North Carolina Wesleyan College in Rocky Mount.

Rickenbacker collected 10 hits in 16 trips to the plate. Included in her hits were a double, triple and home run.

Rickenbacker, a former KMHS basketball and softball standout, is the fifth leading hitter in the Dixie Conference with a .527 batting average.

She will help lead the Battling Bishops into Dixie Conference tournament action Friday at the South Rocky Mount Community Center.

Wesleyan, which is second in the Dixie Conference, is in its last season of slowpitch softball. The team plans to switch to fastpitch next year since the NCAA will sponsor national tournaments in fastpitch only.



Jones Wins Tourney

Bryan Jones of Kings Mountain won the Gaston Junior SpringTennis Tournament last weekend at Gaston College.

Jones was competing in the Boys 14 Division.

Jones, seeded number one. drew a first round bye and then defeated Chris Griffin of Pitt sboro 6-1, 6-0. In the semi-finals. he defeated Joev Sie of Charlotte 6-0, 6-1, and in the championship match, he defeated number two seed Scott Fligel of Charlotte, 6-4, 6-3.

Earlier this year, Jones played in the Bolles Junior Invitational in Jacksonville, Fla. He recorded wins over Kevin Cadora, 6-0, 6-0, Michael Eddings, the number four seed, 6-2, 6-1, and David Witt, the number two seed, 6-7, 6-2, 7-5 in the semifinals, before losing the championship match to top-seeded Steve Parks, 6-2, 4-6, 6-4.

Jones is a 13-year-old eighth grader at Kings Mountain Junior High, where he plays the number one singles position. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Bob lones.

Jeff Guy of Kings Mountain, son of Mr. and Mrs. Ed Guy, won the consolation championship at Gastonia. After losing in the first round of the main draw to Joey Sie of Charlotte, 6-3, 6-3, he defeated Nathaniel McGee of Belmont 6-1, 6-0, and Ted Castano by default. In the finals, he defeated Alan Brown of Statesville, 6-0, 6-1.
