Green, Robert L. Bob Hannon, John Ingram, H. Edward Eddie Knox, Glenn Miller, J.D. Whaley and J.A. Andy Barker. On the Republican ticket James G. Jim Martin and Ruby Thompson Hooper are seeking nomination.

Lt. Gov. Jimmy Green's bid for the governor's seat leaves his postion open for a newcomer. Three Democratic candidates seeking the lieutenant governor's position are Carl J. Stewart of Gaston County, a former Speaker of the House of Representatives, Senator Bob Jordan and Stephen S. Miller. Republicans seeking this position are Erick Little, Barbara Perry, John H. Carrington, William S. Hiatt and Franklin J Five almorth Carolinians are running for the U.S. Senate seat now held by Republican Jesse Helms. Helms is seeking reelection and is being challenged by Republican George Wimbish. On the Democratic ticket are Governor James B. Hunt, Harrill Jones and Tom Allred. This year's presidential ballot

is a long one with eight Democrats seeking the nomination, although several of them have already bowed out of the race. On North Carolina's ballot will be Ernest F. Hollings, Jesse Jackson, George McGovern, Walter F. Mondale, Reubin Askew, Alan Cranston, John Glenn and Gary Hart. There is also a place to mark 'no preference.'

An amendment to the state

constitution also appears on the non partisan ballot. Voters will decide whether to permit the General Assembly to create an agency to issue revenue bonds for agricultural facilities capital projects.

Seeking re-election to the N.C. House of Representatives are John J. Jack Hunt of Lattimore, Edith Lutz of Belwood and Charles D. Owens of Forest City. Jerry O. Adams of Shelby is making his second attempt to unseat one of the incumbents.

With Commissioner of Insurance John Ingram seeking the governor's seat, his position will be open to a newcomer. Running for the position are Billy Martin and James E. Long.

Commissioner of Labor John Brooks is being challenged by Dick Barnes and Don Wiseman. Running for the one Supreme Court associate justice seat are

Raymond M.Taylor and Henry E. Frye. Running for the one Court of Appeals judge seat are John C. Martin, Meyressa Hughes Schoonmaker and Robert L. Cecil.

Thirteen Democrats seek three seats on the Cleveland County Board of Commissioners. They are Doyne Allison, of Boiling Springs; Oliver S. Anthony of Shelby; Henry L. Botts of Shelby; Thomas A.Brown of Shelby; Joyce Falls Cashion of Kings Mountain; Buford D. Cline of Shelby; Bobby J. Crawford of Shelby; Coleman Goforth, incumbent, of Shelby; H. Eugene LeGrand, Route 2, Kings Mountain; T.W. Casey Martin of Lattimore and Carl R. Pearson of Shelby.

Four Republicans seek the three seats on the board. The three chosen will face the three Democrats in November. They are Billy H. Davis, Emile Gebel, Charlie Harry and Ruth B. Wilson, all of Shelby.
