On Thursday, May 3, the Bloodmobile was held at Barnes Auditorium, 167 pints of blood were given. Thank you students and the community for a job well done.


Students received their caps, gowns and announcements on Friday, May 4th.Their graduation pictures were made on Wednesday, May 9.
