Miss Ruff Graduates

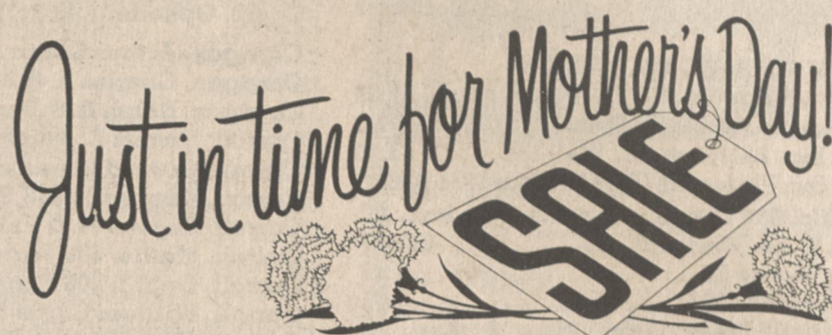
Darleen Ruff, daughter of Abraham and June Ruff of Kings Mountain, received her Secretarial Science diploma April 27 from King's College at Charlotte.

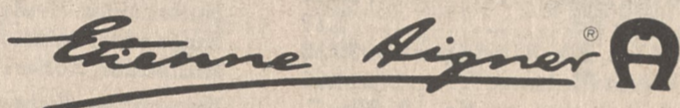

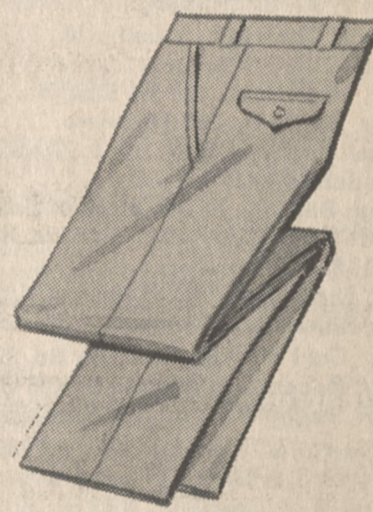
