Bryan Jones Wins Clemson Tennis Tourney

Bryan Jones of Kings Mountain won the Clemson Tiger Junior Tennis Championship in the Boys 14-year-old division May 25-27 at Clemson University.

Jones, seeded 5th-8th alphabetically, defeated Brett Howell of West Union, S.C., 6-0, 6-0 in the opening round. In the second round, he won over Dave



Garner of Greenville, S.C., 6-3, 6-2. In the third round he defeated the number one-ranked player from Alabama, Matt McKelvain, who was seeded third in the tournament. After being down five games to one in the third set and having eight match points against him, Jones came back to win in a tiebreaker, 5-7, 7-6, 7-6.

In the semi-finals, he upset the number one seed in the tourney, Jim Rogerson of Wilson, who is the returning number tworanked player in the South, 6-3, 6-3.

In the finals, Jones whipped John Yancey of Morganton, the number four seed who earlier had won over the number two seed, Joe Frierson of Atlanta. The score was 6-2, 6-2.

Jones, son of Mr. and Mrs. Bobby Jones of Kings Mountain, is 13 years old and an eighth grader at Kings Mountain Junior High School, where he helped lead that school's tennis team to its first ever Western North Carolina Association Championship this spring.

Mike Featherstone was the winning pitcher for the A's, now 13-1.


The A's defeated the Charlotte Bombers 8-5 Sunday with Roy Mathis picking up the win.
