KM Anglers Head Field For Wateree Bass Event

Camden. S.C.-Nearly 170 fishermen have registered to compete July 8 on Wateree Lake in the fifth Carolina Division bass fishing event on the Red Man Tournament Trail. The field may expand by the time all properly postmarked entries are received.

Of the 24 point standings leaders in the Carolina Division, 22 will compete on Lake Wateree. Leading the way are the top five: Charlie Foster of Kings Mountain, Bruce Ellison of Spartanburg, S.C., Mike Seawright of Kings Mountain, Larry J. Parker of Lake City, S.C., and David J. Wright of Lexington, N.C.

Anglers from Florida, Georgia, and Tennessee will join the Carolinians on Lake Wateree. They will be competing for about \$6,562 in total prize money (based on an estimated 175 entrants) with the winner earning about \$2,187. Cash awards go to the top 10 percent of the field.

Competition will begin at dawn on Sunday out of Deal's Marina. Each fisherman is

paired by computer with a partner to assure the integrity of the tournament. Weigh-in time will be around 3 p.m.

Anglers in Red Man Tournament Trail events are encouraged to release their fish live to the waters after weigh-in. Each live fish is worth two bonus ounces.
