The challenge in Eph. 5:14 is awake, arise, and we have the promise of God's Word that Christ shall give thee light.


Let God hold your hand and wake up and live today.

Irving Mond of Charlotte, who survived Adolph Hitler's Holocaust, will be guest speaker at the Men's Brotherhood meeting at First Baptist Church, Kings Mountain, Wednesday, July 12 at 7 p.m.

The public is invited to attend. Mond was a youngster during the Holocaust and saw his parents and other relatives and friends tortured and killed by the Nazis. He spent time in German concentration camps.


Mond is one of six Charlotteans who survived the Holocaust and who are now telling their stories and warning the



Don Mariaschin, assistant national director of the Jewish Anti-Defamation League who spoke at a memorial service to over 50 Holocaust survivors in Charlotte recently, said some of those signs are the continuing struggles of some Arab nations against Israel; international terrorism sponsored by such nations as Syria, Iran, Libya, and North Korea; human rights violations in Argentina; and the Soviet Union's oppression of Eastern Europe and Jews and other groups inside Russia.

"If Israel's enemies succeed in their objective, Hitler's work would be finished," he said. "International terrorism is the new Hitlerism. And it must be stopped now. Then it was Hitler. Today, it might be Libyan leader Muammar Qaddafi."

Over six million Jews and five million Gentiles-mostly gypsies and Poles, were baked, gassed, suffocated, starved, stabbed and shot to death by the Nazis during the Holocaust.


