p.m. If KM wins, it will play again Sunday at 6 p.m. If the KM all-stars lose, they will play Sunday at 2 p.m.

In other opening round games Saturday, Chapel Grove will play West Lincoln at 2 p.m., Dallas faces East Lincoln at 6 p.m. and Grover meets Tryon at 8 p.m.

To get to the East Lincoln park, take Highway 216 to Cherryville, and then Highway 150 to Lincolnton. In Lincolnton take Highway 27 east to Highway 73. On 73, take a left to Highway 16. Take a left on Highway 16. About two miles, there will be a sign on the right which reads "East Lincoln Optimist Park." Take a left at the sign and the park will be on the left.

## Registration Set

Kings Mountain Optimist Club will begin registering players for its Pop Warner football program August 1, 2 and 3 at City Stadium.

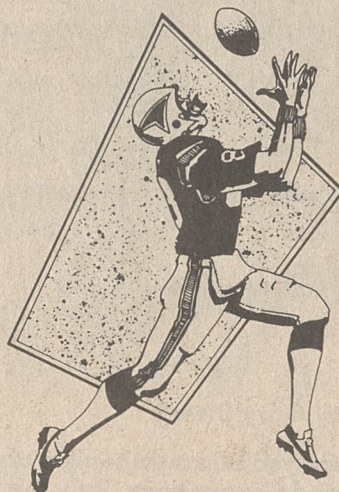
