

Roberts Scores 62 Points

The Lakers lost their first game of the season and James Roberts of the Celtics set a season's scoring record in Boys Club Summer Basketball League action last week at Central School.

Roberts scored 62 points for the Celtics in a 107-106 loss to the Mavericks on Thursday. Tyrone Moore and Bernard Thompson scored 34 points each and Albert Hart added 31 for the Mavericks.


and Brian Byers 18 to lead the Lakers over the Mavericks. Albert Hart had 24 and Tyrone Moore 19 for the losers.
